PRE-SALE REPORT FOR LEASE PURCHASES: Greg Crowe, Ehlers Financial Advisor, reported on the Request for Proposals (RFP) for lease-purchase to finance an addition of 17,260 square feet to S.G. Reinertsen Elementary, including four classrooms, a gymnasium, a storage room, bathrooms, and PE and Music education offices. Ehlers received proposals from three lending institutions: Klein Bank, Kinetic Leasing and Capital One Public Funding.

Ehlers recommended approving the proposal from Klein Bank based on two primary factors: the 2.40 percent interest rate and the upfront cost that the district would incur to execute the lease purchase. Also Klein Bank has the most favorable prepayment terms.

Valan moved, seconded by Altenburg, to approve the Resolution Approving and Authorizing the Execution of a Lease Agreement, a Ground Lease Agreement with Klein Bank from Chanhassen, Minnesota for \$3,410,000 at an interest rate of 2.40 percent. Motion carried 6-0.

Pay STUDENT PRESENTATION: Moorhead High School students Amanda Blanchard, Megan MacFarlane, Shantel Gnahn, Hannah Papenfuss, Elizabeth Schafer, Haley Ludwig, Aamaria Mason, ad Laura LeGare presented information about Philanthropy and Youth (PaY). Pay is designed to introduce local high school students to the importance of leadership and service through grants to nonprofit organizations in the community. The project is an extracurricular club activity in schools and began with student-led committees identifying areas of focus, researching community nonprofits and visiting organizations before deciding how to award the grant money.

Since its inception in 2008, 2,500 PaY participants from 21 area high schools have distributed over \$600,000 in grants to to nonprofit organizations. Moorhead High School and Red River Area Learning Center students have been involved in PaY since 2008. In addition to grantmaking, the Moorhead High School Philanthropy and Youth committee has dedicated numerous hours toward leadership projects aimed at enhancing school climate.

MAJOR MAGNITUDE FIELD TRIP REPORT - ORCHESTRA TO ORLANDO,

FLORIDA: Jon Larson, orchestra teacher, provided information regarding the Moorhead School Orchestra Major Magnitude Field Trip to Orlando, Florida, in March and displayed their awards for "Best in Class" and an excellent rating.

MAJOR MAGNITUDE FIELD TRIP REQUEST - MOORHEAD HIGH SCHOOL

<u>WORLD LANGUAGES</u>: Lana Suomala, Melissa Campbell and Lisa Ferguson, MHS Spanish teachers, provided information related to MHS Spanish students traveling to Spain June 7-22, 2016. The anticipated cost for the trip is \$4,000. Students will fund the trip using their own resources. Financial aid for a portion of the cost may be available to eligible families from the travel company Intercultural Student Experiences.

Valan moved, seconded by Steffes, to approve the Major Magnitude Field Trip request for Moorhead High School World Language students to travel to Spain June 7-22, 2016. Motion carried 6-0.

<u>DRAFT DISTRICT PROFILE FOR 2009-10 THROUGH 2013-14</u>: Missy Eidsness, executive director of school improvement and accountability, presented the district document containing trend data on demographic and student achievement. The data covers a five-year period: 2009-10 through 2013-14. The draft of the District Profiles will be expanded to include similar data for each school site by July 2015.

2015-2016 CALENDAR REVISION: Missy Eidsness, executive director of school improvement and accountability, explained the 2015-16 calendar was approved at the February 22 School Board meeting. A revision to the calendar is necessary due the state precinct caucuses now being held on March 1, 2016, instead of February 2, 2016. The caucus dates were moved from February to March to meet the requirements of the 2016 Presidential nominating process as outlined by the national party committees. According to Minnesota Statute 202A.19 school districts are restricted from holding public meetings after 6 pm.

On the approved 2015-16 calendar K-8 parent-teacher conferences are scheduled to be held on Tuesday, March 1. March 3-4 had been set as vacation days, with March 3 serving as the first emergency makeup day. Tuesday, March 8 remains the Township Election Night. No activities may be held from 6-8 p.m. on election nights.

The recommended revision moves February 29 and March 1 K-8 conferences to March 21-22. The March 3-4 vacation days (and March 3 possible emergency makeup day) move to March 23-24 (attached to the March 25-28 vacation).

Altenburg moved, seconded by Tomhave, to approve the 2015-16 revised calendar as presented. Motion carried 6-0.

SCHOOL DISTRICT FACILITIES UPDATE: Lunak provided updates for the S.G. Reinertsen addition and the Probstfield kitchen commenting both projects were moving ahead favorably.
