Moorhead Community Education held 26 AARP driver safety classes for 597 participants in 2013. Team members are Mary Overby, Connor Neill, Allison Matney and Elizabeth Johnson, and advisor is Moorhead High teacher Michael Kieselbach.

We Are Proud of Horizon Middle School student Cordel Toppen who was selected for membership in the Minnesota Band Directors Association Grades 6-8 Honor Band for the 2013-14 school year. He was one of about 75 students selected from the 313 who auditioned. Toppen is a member of Horizon's 8th grade band, jazz band and honor band. His band teachers are Olivia Latimer and Denise Pesola.

PaY STUDENT PRESENTATION: Moorhead High School students Elizabeth Schafer, Mary Overby, Anna Volk and Trygve Rorvig presented information about Philanthropy and Youth (PaY). PaY is designed to introduce local high school students to the importance of leadership and service through grantmaking. In its eighth year, twenty area high schools were each allocated \$5,000 for use for grantmaking in the community. The project was run as an extracurricular activity in schools and began with student-led committees identifying areas of focus, researching community nonprofits and visiting organizations before deciding how to award the grant money.

Since its inception in 2008, 2,045 PaY participants from 20 area high schools have distributed 630 grants to 212 nonprofit organizations totaling \$530,000. Moorhead High School and Red River Area Learning Center students have been involved in PaY since 2008. In addition to grantmaking, the Moorhead High School Philanthropy and Youth committee has dedicated numerous hours toward leadership projects aimed at enhancing school climate.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE: Kovash provided a legislative update regarding educational funding and reporting changes, teacher evaluation plan and policies.

SCHOOL SECURITY: Larson provided an update on school security, including school district improvements and the Ellen Hopkins Elementary evacuation drill held on May 7. Larson discussed the financial information associated with securing entrances at S.G. Reinertsen Elementary, Hopkins Elementary, Robert Asp Elementary, Probstfield Elementary, Horizon Middle School and Red River Area Learning Center. Financial costs total \$75,860 and will be included in the capital improvements section of the 2014-15 Annual Operating Plan that will be presented to the board in June.

Larson noted a closed session would be held to discuss the findings of building audits completed with the district's emergency management team and school resource officer. A review of the Moorhead High Gap Report, prepared by an NDSU student workgroup, would also be presented.

SECONDARY SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN UPDATES: Lori Lockhart, Horizon Middle School principal, and Jacob Scandrett, Horizon Middle School assistant principal, provided an update on progress made to the strategies for the Horizon school improvement plan goals. Horizon will improve math scores for each grade level 6-8 so the percent of students proficient exceeds the state average by 2 percent as measured by the 2014 MCA assessments. Horizon will improve the reading scores for each grade level 6-8 so the percent of students proficient will be at or exceed the state average as measured by the 2014 MCA-III and Explore assessments. Horizon will improve its safe, healthy and respectful learning environment for students by reducing the major incident reports from 630 in 2012-13 to 599 in 2013-14.

Dave Lawrence, Moorhead High School principal, provided an update of their progress on their strategies to the school improvement plan. Moorhead High School students will be at or above the state average for MCAs and college readiness exams in mathematics. High school students will be at or above the state average for MCAs and college readiness exams in reading. Moorhead High School will improve the graduation rate from 81.5 percent to 84.5 percent by creating a positive school culture that emphasizes student/staff learning, importance of relationships, and improving home/school communications.

<u>APPROVAL OF TEACHER GROWTH AND EVALUATION PLAN</u>: Dehmer reported beginning in 2013-14 a joint committee comprised of representatives of administration and Education Moorhead convened to create a Teacher Growth and Evaluation Plan that meets the Minn. Stat. 122A.40 requirement. The plan promotes growth among the teaching staff at Moorhead Area Public Schools. The committee reached a consensus and Education Moorhead voted to approve the plan on May 12, 2014.

Joint agreement of the Teacher Growth and Evaluation Plan by Education Moorhead and the School Board is required prior to June 1, 2014, in order to adopt the plan created by the committee.

Steffes moved, seconded by Tomhave, to approve the Teacher Growth and Evaluation Plan agreement beginning July 1, 2014. Motion carried 7-0.

FIRST READING OF POLICIES: The board conducted a first reading of the following policies: School Board Evaluation 204, Records Retention 303, Student Activities 540, Student Activity Eligibility 541, Student Activity Fees 542, Student Activities Travel 543, High School Academic, Activity and Varsity Athletic Letters 545, Student Discipline 551, and Prohibition of Harassment and Violence 570.

<u>SCHOOL DISTRICT LOGO AND LICENSING UPDATE</u>: Kovash updated the board on the district's logo and licensing agreement. Kovash reviewed the guidelines, trademark names and mascot logos. The agreement with US Licensing Company for December 2013-2015 provides protection for the school district's intellectual property, improve consistency in branding, allow better control over how the logos, district name and school names are used, and ensures fairness to vendors.

Tomhave moved, seconded by Steffes, to approve the mascot logos, trademark application and licensing agreement as presented. Motion carried 7-0.

SCHEDULE SCHOOL BOARD WORK SESSION: Tomhave moved, seconded by Johnson, approve scheduling Monday, June 9, 2014 from 5:00 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. to conduct a School Board work session to discuss facility recommendations. Motion carried 7-0.

SUPERINTENDENT REPORT: None.

<u>COMMITTEE REPORTS</u>: Brief reports were heard related to the tour of the Bella building, Activities Advisory Council, Health/Safety/Wellness Committee, Technology Committee, Policy Review Committee, Hopkins PTAC, Health Insurance Committee, Indian Education Parent Committee, and Grievance Committee meetings.

OTHER PERTINENT ITEMS TO COME BEFORE THE BOARD: Kovash noted the importance of the partnership the district has with the Moorhead Police Department. Kovash reminded board members of graduation on June 8 at 2 p.m. at MSUM (Nemzek) and asked board members to contact Michelle with their plans to attend.

<u>CLOSE PUBLIC MEETING</u>: Ladwig moved, seconded by Steffes, to close the public meeting at 10:06 p.m., pursuant to M.S. 13D.05, Subd. 3(d) for the purpose of discussing school building security audits. Motion carried 7-0.

Chair Fagerlie recessed the meeting at 10:07 p.m.; reconvened the meeting at 10:14 p.m.
